Why is social innovation relevant to sustainability and resilience?


- Fast in addressing problems or opportunities in a changing context

Could increase impact of research, policies and practice through engagement with receptive groups or individuals.




Changing economic context



The UK national debt has increased from 30% of GDP in 2002 to 80% of GDP in 2014.



Personal/social adaptive response



From 2007 to 2012, there was a sharp rise in private sector saving: from less than £1M to over £20B
