I refer to correspondence last year, explaining the forthcoming legislative changes to the regulation of water pollution, abstraction and impoundment in Scotland, and enclosing an application form for the purpose of transferring from the old regime under COPA to the new one under the Controlled Activities Regulations ("CAR").

SEPA has since received an application to transfer the above-referenced WPC/W/0003311 under CoPA into a water use licence under CAR.

As the 'responsible person' nominated in that application, you are authorised to carry on the controlled activity described in the above CAR/L/1000712 with effect from 1 April 2006, under the above-referenced CAR water use licence, subject to the same conditions that were attached to that consent.

You are personally responsible for securing compliance with the licence and conditions.

In due course SEPA will either send you a full water use licence or refuse your application, but in the mean time this letter is evidence of your authorisation. Please keep it in a safe place.

The attached guidance explains in more detail the process for transferring CoPA consents into CAR licences. I recommend that you read it.

## REVIEWED CONSENT

### UNDER THE CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974

The Clyde River Purification Board, in terms of Section 37(1) of the Control of Pollution Act 1974, have now reviewed CONSENT reference number CP4482 dated 6th Day of September 1973 for a discharge of sewage effluent to controlled waters

in accordance with the particulars contained in the SCHEDULE and subject to the reviewed conditions therein specified. This reviewed consent is nullified if there is any departure, without the written concurrence of the Board, from the application, particulars or plans submitted.

This reviewed consent continues in force until varied or revoked by the Board and is binding on any person discharging effluent from the land or premises to which the consent relates. Failure to comply with a condition of consent is an offence and is punishable under the Control of Pollution Act 1974 by a fine or imprisonment or both. Any appeal against the terms of this consent must, within three months of receipt, be made in writing to the Secretary of State for Scotland and copied to the Board.

This reviewed consent does not exempt the applicant from obtaining permission under, or compliance with, any other statutory or common law requirements.

**CONDITIONS**

- 1    The outlet shall be a 150 mm diameter pipe discharging at National Grid Reference NS 416 878 to below lowest summer water level in Loch Lomond.
  
- 2    The discharge shall be of sewage effluent. As sampled at the sampling chamber to be provided at the outlet from the treatment plant, as shown on drawing number S.1281-5, the discharge shall comply with the following conditions:-
  - (a)    The suspended solids content shall not exceed 15 mg/litre.
  - (b)    The 5 day biochemical oxygen demand at 20°C shall not exceed 10 mg/litre.
  - (c)    The discharge shall not contain any substance in sufficient concentration, either on its own or in combination with other substances which may be present in the discharge or receiving water, to be harmful to flora and/or fauna in Loch Lomond.
  
- 3    The sewage treatment plant shall be maintained in accordance with a specific maintenance schedule supplied by the manufacturer to ensure compliance with the above conditions in respect of this discharge. A record of the maintenance carried out in accordance with the schedule shall be made available to the Board on request. Compliance with this condition is without prejudice to the foregoing conditions.

The above conditions have been imposed in order to promote the cleanliness of controlled waters in the area in accordance with the duties of the Board as laid down in Section 17(1) of the Rivers (Prevention of Pollution) (Scotland) Act 1951 and by the Control of Pollution Act 1974.

Notice revoking this consent or modifying the said conditions, will not, without the written agreement of the person(s) making the discharge, be served by the Board before the 28th Day of November 1997.
