It includes training in the engagement and preparation of people who have been harmed and people responsible for harm, their supporters and the community.

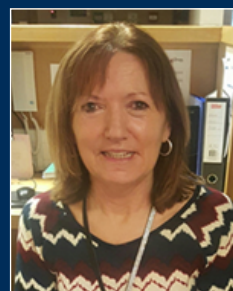
