

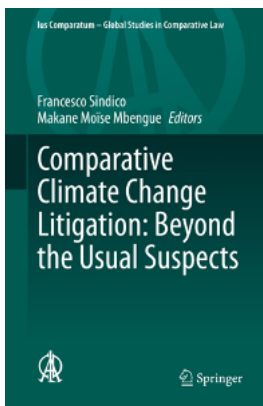

Comparative Climate Change Litigation: Beyond the Usual Suspects - From a Book to a Policy Relevant Tool

Wednesday 10 March, 1-2 PM UK time



This webinar is both a book launch for the edited collection “Comparative Climate Change Litigation: Beyond the Usual Suspects” published by Springer in February 2021 and an introduction to The Climate Change Litigation Initiative (C2LI) that stems directly from the book. Both the book and C2LI have at the heart

an interest in exploring climate litigation also in countries with little or no experience in this field so far. Both the book and the initiative go “beyond the usual suspects” and tackle climate litigation in 30 countries using a scenario based methodology.

Dr Francesco Sindico, one of the two co-editors of the book, will talk about the process of moving from an academic book to a virtual platform aimed at playing an important role in the area of climate litigation. He will clarify how the audiences for the two outputs vary as well its genesis and day-to-day operation. Ultimately, both have brought together a substantial amount of colleagues and expertise interested and passionate about climate litigation. The event will also provide an opportunity to discuss most recent developments in climate litigation in the wake of a renewed interest for climate change in the US with the entry into power of the Biden/Harris administration in the run up to COP26.



Francesco Sindico is the SCELG Co-Director and Director of the Climate Change Litigation Initiative.



The event will be chaired by Kate McKenzie, C2LI Legal Analyst and SCELG PhD researcher.
