Admission

- 1. Notwithstanding the <u>General Academic Regulations Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level</u>, applicants shall possess:
 - i. a first or second class Honours degree of a United Kingdom university, in which Economics constitutes a significant component; or
 - ii. a qualification deemed by the Programme Director acting on behalf of Senate to be equivalent to the above: or
 - iii. have demonstrated competence in Economics obtained at a level of performance acceptable to the Programme Director.
- 2. In all cases, applicants whose first language is not English, shall be required to demonstrate an appropriate level of competence in the English language.

Duration of Study

Mode of Study

4. The programmes are available by full-time, part-time study and by online learning.

Curriculum

- 5. All students shall undertake an approved curriculum as follows:
 - i. for the Postgraduate Certificate in Applied Economics no fewer than 60 credits from the compulsory taught modules listed below,
 - ii. for the Postgraduate Certificate in Economic Policy Development no fewer than 60 credits of compulsory taught modules,
 - iii. for the Postgraduate Diploma in Applied Economics or Economic Policy Development no fewer than 120 credits including all the appropriate compulsory taught modules listed below,
 - iv. for the degree of MSc no fewer than 180 credits.

Award

- 8. **Degree of MSc:** In order to qualify for the award of the degree of MSc in Applied Economics, a candidate must have performed to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners and must have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits, of which 40 must have been awarded in respect of the EC930 Summer Project.
- 9. **Postgraduate Diploma:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Applied Economics or Economic Policy Development, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the taught compulsory modules of the programme.
- 10. **Postgraduate Certificate:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Applied Economics or Economic Policy Development, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the taught compulsory modules of the programme.
