### **Admissions**

- 1. Notwithstanding the <u>General Academic Regulations Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level</u>, applicants shall possess:
  - i. a first or second class Honours degree in History or a related discipline from a United Kingdom university; or
  - ii. a qualification deemed by the Head of Department acting on behalf of the Senate to be equivalent to (i) above.
- 2. In all cases, applicants whose first language is not English, shall be required to demonstrate an appropriate level of English.

# **Examination, progress and final assessment**

- 6. See General Academic Regulations Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level.
- 7. Progress between semesters may be dependent on satisfactory performance against prescribed criteria in the earlier part of the programme.
- 8. The final award will be based on performance in all elements of the coursework and the dissertation.

### **Award**

- 9. **Degree of MSc:** In order to qualify for the award of the degree of MSc in Health History, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits, of which 60 credits must have been awarded in respect of the dissertation V1919.
- 10. **Postgraduate Diploma:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Health History, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the taught modules of the programme.
- 11. **Postgraduate Certificate:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Health History, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the taught modules of the programme.
