Mode of Study

3. The programmes are available by full-time and part-time study. Both the LLM and the Postgraduate Diploma are available by part-time (accelerated) study.

Place of Study

4. As permitted by the [General Academic Regulations - Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level](#), some off-campus work may be required.

Curriculum

5. All students shall undertake an approved curriculum as follows:
 - i. for the Postgraduate Certificate no fewer than 60 credits
 - ii. for the Postgraduate Diploma no fewer than 120 credits
 - iii. for the degree of LLM no fewer than 180 credits including one 60 credit module.

Progress

- Part-time students for the degree of LLM or Postgraduate Diploma shall normally require 40 credits to progress to Year Two.

Award

- Degree of LLM:** In order to qualify for the award of LLM in Human Rights Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits, including 120 taught credits and one 60 credit module as detailed in Regulation 5.
- Postgraduate Diploma in Human Rights Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Human Rights Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 taught credits, from the modules detailed in Regulation 5 above.
- Postgraduate Diploma in Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the taught modules from the programme curriculum.
- Postgraduate Certificate in Human Rights Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Human Rights Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 taught credits from the modules detailed in Regulation 5 above.
- Postgraduate Certificate in Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the taught modules from the programme curriculum.
