These regulations are to be read in conjunction with [General Academic Regulations – Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level](#).

The programme is offered jointly between the University of Strathclyde and collaborative partners, and the awards are made separately by the two Universities i.e. a double award. Students shall be subject to the programme regulations that have been adopted by both Universities and to any other General Regulations, etc. of the University at which they are studying.

Admission

1. See the [General Academic Regulations – Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level](#)
2. In all cases, applicants whose first language is not English, shall be required to demonstrate an appropriate level of English.

Duration of study

3. Notwithstanding the [General Academic Regulations – Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level](#) the minimum period of study for the Masters shall be 36 months. The maximum duration of study will be 72 months.

Mode of study

4. The programme is available by full-time study only.

Place of study

5. The place of study will be as follows:
 - i. First year: this will take place at the partner institution with online study with University of Strathclyde.
 - ii. Second year: this is a placement year which will take place within Scotland with some online study with University of Strathclyde.
 - iii. Third year: this will take place at the University of Strathclyde, on campus.

Curriculum

6. All students shall undertake an approved curriculum as follows:
 - i. for the degree of MSc no fewer than 240 credits including a 40 credit research project,
 - ii. for the Postgraduate Diploma no fewer than 120 credits,
 - iii. for the Postgraduate Certificate no fewer than 60 credits.

Progress

7. The [General Academic Regulations – Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level](#) shall apply.
8. In order to progress to Year 2, a student must have accumulated at least 100 credits from the curriculum.
9. In order to progress to Year 3, a student must have accumulated at least 120 credits from the curriculum.
10. The final award will be based on the student's performance in their assessments.

Award

11. **Degree of MSc:** In order to qualify for the degree of MSc in Language Teaching in Global Contexts, a candidate must have performed to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners and must have accumulated no fewer than 240 credits, of which 40 credits must have been awarded in respect of the XXXXX Dissertation (Language Learning in Global Context).
12. **Postgraduate Diploma:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Language Teaching in Global Contexts, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the programme curriculum with at least 60 credits of modules delivered by the University of Strathclyde.
13. **Postgraduate Certificate:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Language Teaching in Global Contexts, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the programme curriculum with at least 40 credits of modules delivered by the University of Strathclyde.
