Progress

- Part-time students for the degree of LLM or Postgraduate Diploma shall normally require 40 credits to progress to year two.

Award

- Degree of LLM in Law, Technology and Innovation:** In order to qualify for the award of LLM in Law, Technology and Innovation, a candidate must normally have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum and one of the 60-credit modules listed above.
- Degree of MSc in Law, Technology and Innovation:** In order to qualify for the award of MSc in Law, Technology and Innovation, a candidate must normally have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum and one of the 60-credit modules listed above.
- Postgraduate Diploma in Law, Technology and Innovation:** In order to qualify for the

award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Law, Technology and Information, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 taught credits, including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum.

11. **Postgraduate Diploma in Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the taught modules from the programme curriculum.
12. **Postgraduate Certificate in Law, Technology and Innovation:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Law, Technology and Information, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 taught credits, including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum.
13. **Postgraduate Certificate in Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the taught modules from the programme curriculum.
