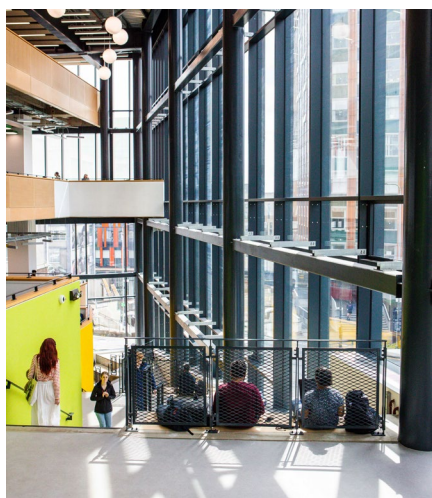

One of our student flats on campus will be open to visitors, and staff on the stand can give you directions.

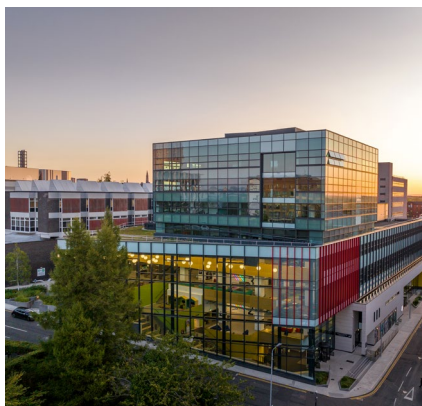

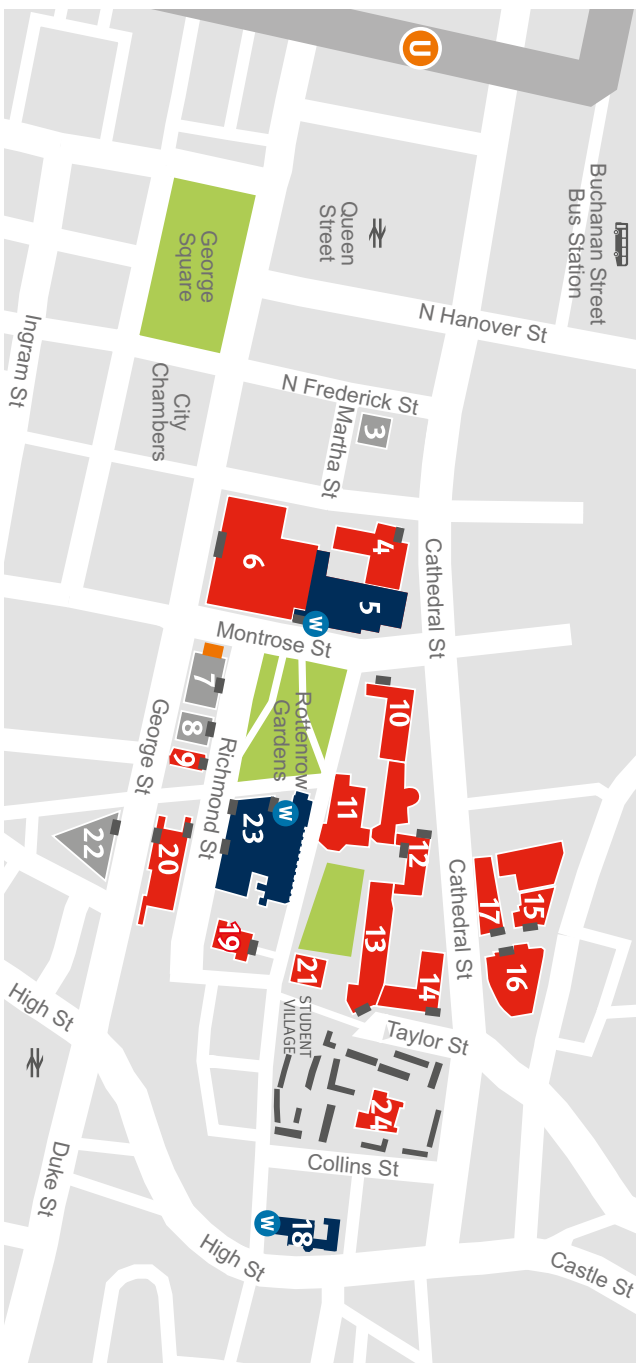
