1 Introduction

The University of Strathclyde ('the University') is a Higher Education establishment based in the centre of the City of Glasgow, which employs over 4,527 staff and has an annual turnover of £430.6 million with an approximate non-pay expenditure of circa £124 million in the reporting period.

More than two hundred years after its foundation in 1796, the University continues to provide a positive contribution to society which is both broad and deep.

Established as 'a place of useful learning' – with a mission to make the world better-educated, prosperous, healthy, fair and secure – we continue to live by our socially-progressive values today.

We have grown our partnerships with business and industry to accelerate and amplify innovation and to boost societal advancement and economic growth in our city, our country and beyond.

We have invested in our campus to deliver a first-class experience for our student body, while continuing our journey to 'net-zero', mindful of sustainability and the urgent need to reduce humankind's impact on our planet.

With the support from such a progressive and innovative organisation, investment in University Procurement has allowed the team to go from strength to strength in numbers and in experience. This has been crucial to ensure the effective and compliant delivery of regulated procurements reported in this period and ongoing.

The University Procurement team continued to be recognised for its outstanding contributions at the prestigious Procurement Government Opportunities (GO) Awards 2024/25. This year, the team received a Highly Commended award in the Social Value category, highlighting their commitment to delivering meaningful impact through procurement practices. Additionally, our Deputy Director of Finance: Procurement was Highly Commended in the Individual of the Year category in recognition of leadership, innovative delivery and dedication.

The team has already achieved finalist status in the 2025/26 GO Awards in two major categories:

- Project of the Year for the procurement and establishment of the UK's first open-access advanced packaging line for power electronics.
- Collaborative Procurement Initiative of the Year for leading the procurement of the Smart Home for the Future Blueprint, on behalf of the Digital Health & Care Innovation Centre (DHI), hosted at the University of Strathclyde, in collaboration with Built Environment – Smarter Transformation (BE-ST) and the Moray Growth Deal (MGD) Housing Mix Delivery (HMD) project.

These accolades reflect the team's innovation and collaborative spirit in driving forward transformative procurement initiatives not only for the benefit of the University but also for the wider economic development within Scotland.

The Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 ('the Act'), requires 'public sector contracting authorities' with regulated procurement activity of £5 million or more per annum to produce a Procurement Strategy and action plan annually, and subsequently to produce an Annual Procurement Report after the end of each financial year. For the purposes of the Act, the University of Strathclyde is a public sector contracting authority. An Annual Procurement

Report reviews the contracting authority's regulated procurement activities against its Annual Procurement strategy.

Accordingly, the University is pleased to publish our sixth annual procurement report covering the period 1st August 2024 to 31st July 2025.

The content of the report covers all Regulated Procurements completed during the period and details how these have supported the objectives of the action plan contained within the University Procurement Strategy.

The key action plan progress is outlined below:

<i>Stakeholder Engagement</i>	<p>A category management approach has been taken across the University with key contact personnel identified for communications. Regular meetings with senior stakeholders are established and a procurement awareness training video was launched in 2021 on the procurement webpages. Further training is delivered to identified target audiences as required. Some departments have recognised the measurable benefits of dedicated procurement resources and now fund dedicated or temporary resource within the central team.</p> <p>2025 saw the roll out of our Business Partnering initiative across our Science and Engineering Faculties. This initiative, established under the University wide Process and Systems Efficiency Programme, seeks to deliver financial savings, improve stakeholder engagement and deliver process efficiency.</p>
<i>Management Information</i>	<p>Our externally facing contracts register is kept up to date, and contracted spend continues to improve year on year. To support ongoing enhancement, quarterly management reports have now been agreed for distribution, providing a regular focus on performance and improvement.</p> <p>A Procurement Toolkit, including template documents, is actively in use, and a full refresh of the toolkit was completed during 2025 to ensure relevance and usability.</p> <p>Management Information has been a key focus during 2024/25, with significant work undertaken in budgetary spend analysis, benefits capture, and supplier line item spend. This activity has involved engagement across the University and the wider sector to secure and develop robust, meaningful, and timely data to inform strategic procurement decisions.</p>
<i>Sustainable Measures</i>	<p>The University's Sustainable Procurement Strategy, Modern Slavery Statement, Annual Procurement Strategy, Supplier Code of Conduct and Socio-Economic and Community Benefits strategy are all available through the University's web pages and where appropriate embedded in tenders along with Fair Work First and ethical labour requirements. Suppliers are requested to advise, when tendering, on the steps their organisation is taking within their operations to ensure that the Net Zero targets of the University and Scottish Government are being met.</p>

<i>Procedures and Practices</i>	<p>All regulated Procurements have a contract strategy to determine the best route to market for each contract. Annual expenditure analysis including the cycle for review and retender is managed by category managers.</p> <p>The team recognise that contract and supplier's performance should be managed throughout the duration of every contract to ensure that the University receives the quality and service at the cost originally quoted, the approach and level of management required in order to achieve this differs based primarily on the financial and service risk associated with each contract. The team utilise a tiering tool to assess the level of management required. The role of contract owners are clearly defined and support/escalation provided where contracts are managed out with the procurement team.</p> <p>Savings and benefits are identified and reported in line with the Scottish Government procurement benefits tracking model.</p>
<i>Procure to Pay (P2P)</i>	<p>P2P is considered as part of every contract strategy and the most efficient payment method for the contract. University procurement has ownership of the supplier master files on the University's Financial Management System. A 'No Purchase Order No Payment' policy is upheld in line with the University's financial regulations, and non-essential routes for requests for payment without a Purchase Order have been limited to exceptions only.</p>
<i>Collaboration</i>	<p>All appropriate collaborative frameworks are utilised. The team sit on collaborative forums and approximately 47.8% of the University's third-party spend went through collaborative agreements, based on FY 24/25. This is a slight increase from last year's figure.</p>

2 Summary of Regulated Procurement

Section 18(2)(a) of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 requires organisations to include: “a summary of the Regulated Procurements that have been completed during the year covered by the report”.

Regulated Procurement refers to any procurement above £50,000 for goods and services or £2 million for works. A regulated procurement is completed when the award notice is published or where the procurement process otherwise comes to an end. Regulated procurements can refer to new contracts and framework agreements but also to mini-competitions and call-offs from existing framework agreements as well as negotiated procedures.

Over the period, the University has awarded a total of 172 Regulated Procurements at a potential value of circa £90 million. Whilst this report focuses on Regulated Contracts the University Procurement Team is responsible for all spend above £25,000, In total, the team awarded 294 contracts during the reporting period.

Section 9 of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 details the sustainable procurement duty and in particular the facilitation of the involvement of small and medium-sized enterprises (“SMEs”). During the period circa £65.6 million of the £124.3 million third party spend was with SMEs. Of 172 regulated contracts awarded during the period , 104 included awards to SMEs. It is important to note that some contracts included multiple awarded suppliers. A record of our progress in contracting with SMEs is displayed in figure 1A below.

During the period, University Procurement have also created contracts through quick quoting or utilising available framework agreements from the collaborative bodies for example, Advanced Procurement Universities and Colleges (APUC), Scotland Excel, Crown Commercial Services or Scottish Government and existing University frameworks to create non-regulated spend contracts. A record of our collaborative contracting activities is also displayed below in Figure 1B.





The University is committed to working with our suppliers to encourage fair working practices and all tendered contracts include an appendix to record details from our suppliers. In contracts awarded during this period, 61 suppliers have committed to paying the real living wage and 26 are accredited real living wage employers. The progress and success of our activities are displayed below in Figure 2. Annex A includes details on the number of contracts where fair work was included as a scored award criterion. This data includes call-offs and direct awards from Frameworks where the Framework has considered this element.



Appendix 1 shows a full list of the individual procurements completed. There were also some instances where exemptions, Regulation 33, negotiated procedure without prior publication or Regulation 15, Research and Development Services of the Public Contracts (Scotland) Regulations 2015 were utilised after assessment and approval.

3 Review of Regulated Procurement Compliance

Section 17 of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 requires that Regulated Procurements be carried out in accordance with the organisation's procurement strategy, so far as reasonably practical. Section 18(2) states that an annual procurement report must include, at 18(2)(b), "a review of whether those procurements complied with the authority's procurement strategy" and, at 18(2)(c), "to the extent that any Regulated Procurements did not comply, a statement of how the University intends to ensure that future Regulated Procurements do comply".

Further details on the requirements within the Act can be found in Appendix 2.

The University's [Procurement Strategy](#) sets out how regulated procurement is intended to be undertaken in compliance with the act and supports the University's Strategic Plan - Strathclyde 2030. It also sets out the strategic institutional approach to procurement within a challenging economic, legislative and regulatory environment, including support for University policies.

Regulated Procurements are undertaken with consideration of the World Trade Organisation's (WTO) Government Procurement Agreement (GPA) principles of non-discrimination, transparency and procedural fairness.

The relevant legislation and the University's internal rules governing procurement activity are followed and this is all supported by a comprehensive procurement toolkit containing templates and supporting documents, which are aligned with the Scottish Government's Procurement Journey.

The University is committed to ensuring that suppliers are paid within 30 days or less. The procurement team work closely with the accounts payable team within finance to improve payment processes across all contracts.

A 'No PO No Payment' policy is upheld and all suppliers are encouraged to deliver electronic invoices directly to accounts payable to support paperless, timeous and efficient payment processes.

3.1 Audit and Compliance

External and Internal Audit



The University Procurement team were independently assessed under the Scottish Government Procurement Commercial Improvement Programme (PCIP) in October 2019 and achieved a score of 88%. This rating sits in the upper half of the F1 performance band and shows an improved performance of 37% on the previous assessment score from 2016.

In December 2023, an independently assessed “pulse check” was undertaken. This is a shorter, lighter touch assessment focusing on strategic aspects of procurement. The results of this assessment confirm that the University has maintained and improved upon its high-level performance since the 2019 assessment. The assessment specifically noted a high level of influence over spend, and involvement in strategic decision-making, further commenting that there has been development in several key areas such as capability, continuous improvement and contract and supplier management.

Overall, the Procurement Team’s effectiveness and activities have increased producing a rise in complex regulated procurements and the social impact from these activities.

In July 2020 the University’s Internal Audit Service (IAS) undertook an assessment which involved reviewing the University Procurement’s tendering procedures in relation to Scottish and EU legislation with specific focus on the processes in place to evaluate tenders and provide feedback to unsuccessful tender candidates.

The purpose of this audit was to provide management with assurance that goods, services, and works which meet the relevant thresholds for tendering procedures to be used, have been procured in accordance with the University’s policies and procedures, taking cognisance of other relevant external guidance.

The Head of IAS's review returned the overall evaluation for this review as "Substantial Assurance", stating, *"this is the highest return meaning controls are robust and well managed. Risk governance and control procedures are effective in supporting delivery of any related objectives. Any exposure to potential weakness is low and materiality of any consequent risk is negligible."*

A review of the University's Arrangements for Contract Management was undertaken and presented to the Audit and Risk Committee in May 2021. This report provided a return of "reasonable assurance" with no high risks identified. The risks that were identified, focused on areas where devolved contract management was in place. The report further noted that where the University Procurement played a critical role in the Contract management process, there were identifiable tangible and intangible benefits delivered to the University. The report also recognised that resources do not allow for full contract and supplier management coverage by University Procurement.

In 2023 Procurement Team launched Contract and Supplier Management Guidance across the University, providing a contract tiering tool to ascertain the level and frequency of management requirements as well as defining the role and responsibilities of contract managers against each contract.

During 24/25 the University's Executive Team approved the introduction of a Procurement Business Partnering function with the remit to deliver savings on low value purchases through commercial focus, negotiation, demand management and redirection of spend where appropriate whilst reducing supply chain and contractual risks and increase compliance. This initiative has commenced in our Engineering and Science Faculties and will develop into our Estates and ISD Directorate early 2026.



Compliance

Our review of the Regulated Procurements was completed and our update to the Procurement Strategy has identified some areas for improvement as follows:

- Continue to develop and enhance communications and relationships with our stakeholders by providing innovative procurement solutions to support delivery of their contracts.
- Widen our Business Partnering Approach across other areas of the Institution
- Continue to promote the available Procurement awareness training which is embedded on the procurement web pages to broaden access for stakeholders. Focus on the delivery of targeted departmental training through our Business Partnering network.
- Embed requirements and actively seek opportunities to maximise social, economic, and environmental outcomes through contracting activities.
- Work closely with our colleagues in Sustainable Strathclyde to target specific categories and subsequent contracts to secure reductions in CO₂.
- Encourage the suppliers we spend with to register with EcoVadis to measure and monitor sustainability in our supply chains.
- Further develop reporting mechanisms that drive compliance in our procurement activity for internal and external distribution.
- Focus on the delivery of benefits through efficient P2P mechanisms including content management and electronic invoicing
- Support staff development and continue to align with the [Scotland's National Procurement and Commercial Competency Framework](#)

3.2 Improvements and Efficiency Return

Efficiency savings are returned on an annual basis. Procurement have returned the values in Figure 4 with steady results year on year. Results in this area are affected by the number and value of contracts awarded year on year. Larger savings typically occur when major construction projects or frameworks are awarded.



3.3 Climate change and Carbon Footprint

The University's supply chain represents one of its most significant areas of environmental impact. The procurement team has been working closely with colleagues in Sustainable Strathclyde to identify high-carbon-footprint activities and explore opportunities to reduce waste and resource use. This includes adopting more efficient and circular approaches to procuring and utilising goods, services, and works.

The University recognises that its procurement activities have environmental, social, and economic impacts. In response, the procurement team is committed to developing contract strategies that minimise or mitigate negative environmental effects, supporting the University's broader sustainability goals.

The contract strategy used for all regulated procurements was refreshed during 2025 to require procurement professionals within the University Procurement to outline how this procurement will meet our Sustainable Procurement Journey. The 4 aims of this section of the strategy are as below:

- Aim 1: Tackle climate change and reduce resource use
- Aim 2: Be socially responsible
- Aim 3: Collaborate with others to embed sustainability across the institution
- Aim 4: Share learning and knowledge to help ensure continuous improvement

In the majority of tenders for large-scale contracts, University Procurement seeks to generate innovations in the use of supply chain management for all materials used in the production of the equipment, as well as production techniques, to minimise impacts upon the environment and actively consider energy consumption of the equipment in the tender process. The team use the award criteria to actively score suppliers on their management of essential elements including but not limited to product lifecycle, delivery maximisation, energy consumption, waste products and decommissioning. University Procurement worked with colleagues in Sustainable Strathclyde, the University's driving force on sustainability and carbon reduction, to develop category-specific sustainability questions focusing on the aforementioned elements.


Outlined below are a few examples of contractual requirements and successful outcomes.

Over cladding works.

This project involves the design, manufacture, supply, and installation of over-cladding for the John Anderson Building, which has experienced persistent water ingress issues over several years. The project is funded through the Scottish Funding Council's (SFC) University Financial Transactions Programme (UFTP) and forms part of the University's net-zero pathway programme, aligned with our Strategic Plan (*Strathclyde 2030*) to reduce carbon emissions as a key performance indicator.

Building fabric and services improvements have been identified as high-priority projects essential to achieving these challenging but mandated targets. The contract strategy and award criteria placed strong emphasis on carbon reduction and on the contractor's approach to lowering their own operational emissions. The resulting contracts have significantly

improved the building's energy performance, reducing heat loss from 589.0 kW to 323.8 kW—a 54.97% reduction achieved through enhancements to the building fabric and air permeability.



Furniture:

Furniture is an area of high spending and high embodied carbon that generates a large amount of potentially avoidable waste. A collaboration between the University's Procurement, Portering and Sustainability departments is currently underway to trial re-use and refurbishment of existing stock over buying new. The trial aims to provide a detailed evaluation of both the short-term and long-term financial implications, as well as the potential environmental and social benefits.

The University maintains a dedicated storage facility for unused/unwanted furniture. As part of the ongoing research, an analysis is being conducted to compare the cost implications of repurposing existing furniture versus purchasing new items. This aims to quantify potential cost savings, not only in terms of procurement but also in relation to waste management. The research will evaluate the financial benefits of waste avoidance, reductions in disposal tonnage, and associated carbon savings.

This approach supports the University's commitment to sustainability by reducing waste and extending product lifespans. To date the initiative has had the following positive impact:

43 Tonnes of CO2 reduced due to avoiding manufacturing

9 Tonnes of waste to landfill avoided.

£33k in cost savings due to refurbishing, and reduced transportation costs.

National Manufacturing Institute Scotland (NMIS)

The team led the procurement of contracts to support the Construction of the NMIS) which completed in Spring 2023. The reporting period saw a full year of operation. The facility is the first operational ‘energy carbon neutral’ building in the University with all related contracts having sustainability as a core aspect including:

- Low carbon materials used, saving around 700t CO2e compared to steel frame
- Green roof, indoor green wall & active travel infrastructure
- Key anchor load for a 3.5km ambient district heating scheme
- 600kW of installed solar PV capacity on the roof
- NMIS provides a space for cutting edge research into digital manufacturing, with a focus on sustainability, re-manufacture for circular economy, and new technologies that will support a net-zero economy.



Laboratory Equipment

The Procurement Team works closely with Sustainable Strathclyde to identify laboratory activities with a high carbon footprint and explore opportunities for improvement. During the reporting period, 54 contracts incorporated significant climate considerations as part of the award criteria.

In the Laboratory and Engineering category, this resulted in several key initiatives:

- **Autoclave Replacement:** The supply, delivery, and commissioning (including disposal of the existing unit) of an autoclave for the Science Faculty, which uses 70 litres less water and 1.2 kWh less electricity per cycle.
- **Energy-Efficient Freezers:** End-of-life laboratory freezers were replaced with more energy-efficient models, saving an estimated 78,850 kWh compared to the previous units.
- **Bioinert UHPLC Installation:** The supply, delivery, installation, and commissioning of a Bioinert UHPLC system. The supplier's sustainability programme has reduced GHG emissions by 27% since 2016, aligning with their goal of a 35% reduction by 2025. Packaging was redesigned to reduce shipping weights and increase container capacity, saving approximately 60,000 kg of packaging materials in 2022 and eliminating 485 metric tons of CO₂ emissions across the extended value chain.

The Procurement Team has been recognised within the Scottish public sector for its achievements in sustainable procurement, demonstrating that collaboration is key to meeting the University's climate ambitions. To this end, the team has established a formal collaboration process with Sustainable Strathclyde to ensure early involvement and senior representation at the Sustainable Strathclyde Steering Group. Regular project-level meetings identify opportunities to embed sustainability, which then become contractual obligations monitored throughout the project lifecycle. The team also remains actively engaged in sector and national strategy working groups.



4 Community Benefit Summary

Section 18(2)(d) of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 states that it is mandatory for an annual procurement report to include “a summary of any Community Benefit requirements imposed as part of a regulated procurement that were fulfilled during the year covered by the report”. Section 25 of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 mandates that all contracting authorities “must consider whether to impose Community Benefit requirements as part of the procurement” when the estimated contract value is greater than or equal to £4 million.

However, Community Benefits are a key objective of the University’s Procurement Strategy and [Socio Economic and Community Benefit Impact Strategy \(the ‘Strathclyde Commitment’\)](#), which states that Community Benefits will be formally considered where it is appropriate and proportionate to do so where the total contract is above the value noted below:

- goods and services contracts with an estimated value greater than £50,000
- works contracts with an estimated value greater than £2 million

The values of the ‘Strathclyde Commitment’ are in line with the University’s overarching values and include:

- **People-oriented:** Suppliers will be encouraged and evaluated to provide benefits that will provide opportunities for Strathclyde students, that will support and invest in their development.
- **Bold:** The ‘Strathclyde Commitment’ will take the mandatory legislation and develop it into a benefit for the organisation. Challenging the boundaries of standard contracts to add value for our students.
- **Innovative:** A Higher Education focus has been applied to the Community Benefits options offered to suppliers that will encourage them to come forward with creative and new ideas on what can be delivered for the University.
- **Collaborative:** The ‘Strathclyde Commitment’ is a collaboration between procurement and the sustainability team. It is intended to widen this to a collaborative forum which will encompass stakeholders within the University and the wider community to produce tangible benefits.
- **Ambitious:** Adopting this consistent approach will be an ambitious step for the University as the Higher and Further education sector has limited published use of this practice. Community Benefits will be included in all appropriate contracts where it is proportionate to do so.

Appendix 3 provides full details of Community Benefit’s secured and delivered during the period.



This commitment includes taking the opportunity to include a range of community-based benefits as a result of procurement activity. This is achieved through the inclusion of specific clauses within procured contracts known as, the 'Strathclyde Commitment' clauses.

The University Procurement Team have established a Community Benefits Working Group to ensure we hold suppliers accountable to delivering a wide range of benefits for the University community and beyond. Our procurement requirements are paramount in providing the infrastructure for ensuring the University maintains its reputation as leading technological institution, and in harnessing significant social, economic, and environmental benefits within the local community. This consideration supports the sustainable procurement duty placed on the University by the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014. Under the Act, the University has an obligation to consider the inclusion of Community Benefits on all Procurements over £4m (Section 25(1) of the act).

Community benefits are built into contracts where appropriate, at strategy stage. We provide a menu of potential benefits which is adjusted to be relevant to the scope of work, and bidders can then select against these and submit with their bid.

Once a tender has been awarded, the benefits offered become a contractual deliverable. The Community Benefits Working Group oversee the delivery of those benefits and suggest particular initiatives that could be the focus of future benefit solicitation to the procurement team. This group features representation from Sustainability, Strathclyde Students Union, Careers and Employability and Education Enhancement. Group membership can flex and grow as required.

Key Community Benefit outcomes to report

FM Services

The University awarded a Hard and Soft FM contract for its satellite sites in Renfrewshire and Cumbernauld. Under this contract, the supplier, Skanska Construction UK Limited, committed to delivering a range of community benefits. Some of these were achieved during the reporting period, while others are ongoing:

Modern Apprenticeships:

- *Apprentice 1* was employed as a Modern Apprentice to support the Strathclyde contract and successfully completed a Diploma in Digital Application Support at SCQF Level 6 in 2024. They have since progressed into a Contract Administrator role.
- *Apprentice 2* was also employed as a Modern Apprentice and is currently completing an SCQF Level 5 in Business Administration, with plans to progress to a Diploma in Digital Skills.

Supply Chain Development:

The supplier delivered a wide range of initiatives to support upskilling across the supply chain, including training and development opportunities. One highlight was an awareness and knowledge session on becoming an effective mentor, delivered in collaboration with EQUATE Scotland. The session covered topics such as understanding unconscious bias and its impact on women in STEM.

In total, 11 sessions covering various business initiatives were delivered, benefiting over 50 attendees from the supply chain.

Legal Services

Anderson Strathern, our provider of Legal Service Support has delivered a number of the benefits secured through their contract within the reporting period, these include

- Sponsorship of student awards for outstanding contribution
- Student Mentoring
- Attendance and participation in improving access and career event
- Presenting at career events
- 10-week work experience opportunities

As a result of a renewed focus on Community benefits this year saw a large number of benefits offered through contracts some highlights of the benefits secured are noted below:

Hydraulic servicing and repairs for The National Manufacturing Institute of Scotland (NMIS)

Under this two-year contract (with the option to extend for a further two years), the supplier will undertake the servicing, maintenance, and repair of specialist machinery and equipment housed across the NMIS facility. As part of their contractual obligations, the supplier has committed to delivering a range of community benefits, including:

Targeted Recruitment and Employment: Two new entrants, one unemployed or underemployed graduate, and one new-start Modern Apprentice.

Student Benefits: Funding and sponsorship for a place on a PhD programme, work experience placements, and industry awareness days.

The supplier has also focused on outcomes for students participating in our Project Search Programme—a one-year transition initiative that helps individuals with additional needs or autism move into the working world through training and education. Planned activities include student engagement sessions, workplace tours, recruitment support, consideration of internships, guaranteed interviews, and work trials, offering invaluable support to the project and its participants.

Minor Maintenance Framework Agreement

During the reporting period the Procurement team awarded the above Framework at a total value of circa £8 million. During the 4 year lifespan of the agreement the team will work with the Contractors to ensure that the agreement delivers more than just the intended works as within the contracts awarded the agreement is set to deliver a range of benefits including but not limited to 18 new entrants 2 graduate new entrants, 15 apprenticeships, sponsorship of PhD students, short term apprenticeships and support to over 27 community projects.

5 Supported Businesses

Section 18(2)(e) of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 requires organisations to include “a summary of any steps taken to facilitate the involvement of supported businesses in regulated procurements during the year covered by the report”.

In line with our socially progressive ethos, the University continues to engage with Supported Businesses, most significantly through our mattress and bedframe contract. This contract, awarded through the Scottish Government’s Framework Agreement for supported factories and businesses, was awarded to Dovetail Enterprises Limited who unfortunately ceased trading during the reporting period. In our commitment to Supported Businesses the procurement team have sought to undertake a review of alternative providers in this sector. Following that assessment, which included product testing, the team will undertake a mini competition through the aforementioned Framework the outcome of which will be a circa £400k contract awarded to a Supported Business early in 2026. This contract will support sustained employment for disabled and/or disadvantaged people.

Our overall spend with supported business during the reporting period has been affected by the situation with Dovetail Enterprises Limited. In total our spend was £50,187, this spend is predicted to increase in 2526 with the award of the new contract.

6 Future Regulated Procurements Summary

Appendix 2 – Requirements of the Act

Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 asp 12 Part 2 General duties Section 8

8 General duties

- (1) A contracting authority must, in carrying out a regulated procurement—
 - (a) treat relevant economic operators equally and without discrimination,
 - (b) act in a transparent and proportionate manner.
- (2) A contracting authority must also comply with the sustainable procurement duty.
- (3) However, a contracting authority must not do anything in pursuance of subsection (2) that would conflict with its duty under subsection (1).
- (4) A relevant economic operator is an economic operator who is a national of, or is established in—
 - (a) a member State, or
 - (b) Iceland, Liechtenstein or Norway.
- (5) Subsection (1) does not apply in relation to an EU-regulated procurement.

9 Sustainable procurement duty

- (1) For the purposes of this Act, the sustainable procurement duty is the duty of a contracting authority—
 - (a) before carrying out a regulated procurement, to consider how in conducting the procurement process it can—
 - (i) improve the economic, social, and environmental wellbeing of the authority's area,
 - (ii) facilitate the involvement of small and medium enterprises, third sector bodies and supported businesses in the process, and
 - (iii) promote innovation, and
 - (b) in carrying out the procurement, to act with a view to securing such improvements identified as a result of paragraph (a)(i).
- (2) The contracting authority must consider under subsection (1) only matters that are relevant to what is proposed to be procured and, in doing so, consider the extent to which it is proportionate in all the circumstances to take those matters into account. 26 26
- (3) In this section—
 - “Small and medium enterprises” means businesses with not more than 250 employees,

- “Third sector bodies” means organisations (other than bodies established under an enactment) that exist wholly or mainly to provide benefits for society or the environment.

(4) In this section, references to the wellbeing of the authority's area include, in particular, reducing inequality in the area.

Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 asp 12 Part 2 Procurement strategy and annual report Section 15

15 Procurement strategy

(1) A contracting authority which expects to have significant procurement expenditure in the next financial year must, before the start of that year—

- (a) prepare a procurement strategy setting out how the authority intends to carry out regulated procurements, or
- (b) review its procurement strategy for the current financial year and make such revisions to it as the authority considers appropriate.

(2) Subsection (3) applies where a contracting authority—

- (a) has not, in relation to a financial year, prepared or reviewed a strategy under subsection (1), and
- (b) becomes aware of the likelihood of having significant procurement expenditure during that year.

(3) The contracting authority must, as soon as practicable after it becomes aware of the likelihood of having significant procurement expenditure—

- (a) prepare a procurement strategy setting out how the authority intends to carry out regulated procurements, or
- (b) review its most recent procurement strategy and make such revisions to it as the authority considers appropriate.

(4) An authority has significant procurement expenditure in a year if the sum of the estimated values of the contracts to which its regulated procurements in that year relate is equal to or greater than £5,000,000.

(5) The procurement strategy must, in particular—

- (a) set out how the authority intends to ensure that its regulated procurements will
 - (i) contribute to the carrying out of its functions and the achievement of its purposes,
 - (ii) deliver value for money, and
 - (iii) be carried out in compliance with its duties under section 8,
- (b) include a statement of the authority's general policy on—
 - (i) the use of community benefit requirements,
 - (ii) consulting and engaging with those affected by its procurements,

- (iii) the payment of a living wage to persons involved in producing, providing or constructing the subject matter of regulated procurements,
 - (iv) promoting compliance by contractors and sub-contractors with the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 (c.37) and any provision made under that Act, and
 - (v) the procurement of fairly and ethically traded goods and services,
- (c) include a statement of the authority's general policy on how it intends its approach to regulated procurements involving the provision of food to—
- (i) improve the health, wellbeing and education of communities in the authority's area, and
 - (ii) promote the highest standards of animal welfare,
- (d) set out how the authority intends to ensure that, so far as reasonably practicable, the following payments are made no later than 30 days after the invoice (or similar claim) relating to the payment is presented—
- (i) payments due by the authority to a contractor,
 - (ii) payments due by a contractor to a sub-contractor,
 - (iii) payments due by a sub-contractor to a sub-contractor,
- (e) address such other matters as the Scottish Ministers may by order specify.
- (6) The Scottish Ministers may by order modify subsection (4) so as to substitute for the figure specified there for the time being such other figure as they consider appropriate.
- (7) In subsection (5)(b)(iii), a “living wage” means remuneration which is sufficient to ensure an acceptable standard of living.

Appendix 5 - Glossary

Commodity

A group of similar goods and/or services.

Community Benefits

Community Benefits are requirements which deliver wider benefits in addition to the core purpose of a contract. These can relate to social, economic and or environmental benefits.

Procurement

The tasks and decisions, which secure an external provider to provide goods, works or services. Activity is focused from strategy stage prior to advertising a tender to signing the contract. It includes both competitive tenders and negotiations with a single provider.

Regulated Procurement

Regulated Procurement refers to any Procurement above £50,000 for Supplies and Services or £2,000,000 for Works.

Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs)

Enterprises/Companies that have less than 249 employees or an annual revenue of less than £22.8m.

Stakeholder

Any person or group who has a vested interest in the success of the procurement activity, i.e. either provides services to it, or receives services from it.

Supplier

An entity that provides something needed such as a product or service.

Supported Business

An organisation whose main aim is the social and professional integration of disabled or disadvantaged persons and at least 30 per cent of the employees of those businesses should be classed as disabled or disadvantaged.

Sustainable Procurement

A process whereby organisations meet their needs for goods, services, works and utilities in a way that achieves value for money on a whole life basis and generates benefits, not only for the organisation but also to society, the economy and the environment.

Third Sector

The part of an economy or society comprising non-governmental and non-profitmaking organisations or associations Work Plan List of upcoming procurement activity including re-tenders, extensions, and new activity.

Quick Quote

A non-regulated quotation process conducted by electronic means by inviting 3 or more suppliers to make a bid for goods, works or services.
